

Theology Matters: An Introduction to Hebrews

Session 2: Warnings and Encouragements (3:6b, 14; 6:4-20)

The book of Hebrews contains a number of warnings, using strong and challenging language. But it also contains many equally strong encouragements about the faithfulness of God. This session considers who the warning passages are directed to, and how we should understand them.



Warnings and Encouragements (3:6b, 14)

How do 3:6b and 3:14 help us understand the warnings in Hebrews?

'We are his house, if indeed we hold firmly to our confidence and the hope in which we glory.' (3:6b)

'We have come to share in Christ, if indeed we hold our original conviction firmly to the very end' (3:14)

Cause > Effect Conditional	Evidence > Inference Conditional
The Cause leads to the Effect:	The Evidence leads to the Inference
e.g. 'If her husband dies (cause) she is released from the law of marriage (effect)' (Romans 7:2)	e.g. 'If you are left without discipline (evidence) then you are illegitimate children and not sons (inference)' (Heb 12:8)
'If you persevere, you will share in Christ'	'If we persevere that will show that you have come to share in Christ'
	'The writer to the Hebrews has deliberately made a past event dependent on a future condition, because perseverance in faith is a defining mark of those who are truly believers.' (Wilson, Hebrews 3:6b and 3:14 Revisited)
	'Hebrews virtually defines true believers as those who hold firmly to the end the confidence that they had at first.' (D.A. Carson, Reflections on Assurance, p267)



Warnings and Encouragements (6:4-12)

How should we interpret the warnings in Hebrews 6:4-8?

'It is impossible for those who have once been enlightened, who have tasted the heavenly gift, who have shared in the Holy Spirit, who have tasted the goodness of the word of God and the powers of the coming age and who have fallen away, to be brought back to repentance. To their loss they are crucifying the Son of God all over again and subjecting him to public disgrace. Land that drinks in the rain often falling on it and that produces a crop useful to those for whom it is farmed receives the blessing of God. But land that produces thorns and thistles is worthless and is in danger of being cursed. In the end it will be burned.' (Hebrews 6:4-8)

Are these verses referring to believers?	
<u>No</u>	Yes
Compare to passages like Romans 8:29-30; John 6:39-40, 44	The author includes himself in four of the five major warnings (2:1-4; 4:1; 10:26; 12:25-29)

Hebrews 'recognises a kind of transitory faith, a form of conversion which, like the seed sown on rocky places [Mark 4] has all the signs of life, but which does not persevere.' (D.A. Carson)

They are 'brothers' (3:12) who 'received knowledge of the truth' (10:26), have been 'sanctified' and then 'outraged the Spirit of grace' (10:29)

Acts 10:44-48

What do the warnings achieve?

The warnings are 'a means of preserving God's people in faith to the end. This causes him both to urge perseverance and warn against apostasy in the strongest possible terms, and to have confidence that the readers will heed his warnings if they have in fact become partners with Christ, since he sees his warnings are God's way of preventing the readers from apostasy.' (Wilson, p265)

Warnings and Encouragements (6:13-20)

What is the basis of the author's confidence?

'Abraham waited patiently...' (v15)

25 years (Gen 12:4; 21:5; Heb 11:13)

'Men swear by someone greater...' (v16)

Abraham swore by God (Gen 14:22; 21:23-24; 24:3)

'Because God wanted to make the unchanging nature of his purpose very clear to the heirs of what was promised, he confirmed it with an oath' (v17)

God swore by himself (Gen 22:16-17. Also Exod 32:13; Isa 45:23; Jer 22:5)

'We who have fled to take hold of the hope...' (v18)

'We have this hope as an anchor for the soul...' (v19-20)

Anchor (Acts 27). Melchizedek (5:10)
